#### Tips on Winning a Scholarship

- 1. Start searching for scholarships as soon as possible. Don't wait until spring of your senior year in high school to start searching, or you'll miss half the deadlines. Continue searching for scholarships even after you are enrolled in college. Consider this like a full-time job.
- 2. Answer all of the optional questions on a scholarship matching web site for about twice as many matches.
- 3. Use a free scholarship matching service like some of those you will find at the end of this bulletin.
- 4. Apply to every scholarship for which you are eligible. Pursue less competitive scholarships, such as small awards and essay contests, since they are easier to win and the money adds up and helps you win bigger scholarships.
- 5. Don't miss deadlines. Use a calendar and checklist to get organized.
- 6. Tailor your application to the sponsor's goals. Read and follow the instructions carefully.
- 7. If you have difficulty writing essays, try recording yourself as you answer the question out loud, and transcribe the recording later. Most people can think and speak faster than they can write or type. Create an outline afterward to organize your thoughts.
- 8. Personalize your essay and be passionate. Write about something of interest to you. Make your application stand out from the crowd. Talk about your impact on other people. Give examples and be specific.
- 9. Use a professional email address, such as firstname.lastname@gmail.com. Clean up the content of your Facebook/Instagram/Snapchat etc... accounts, removing inappropriate and immature material.

# Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP) and Financial Assistance Program (FAP)

• Armed Forces Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP)

Each year the Air Force awards scholarships through the Armed Forces Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP). It pays for tuition, books and most fees. The HPSP also gives students a monthly stipend for living expenses while they attend the school of their choice. Students should be U.S. citizens and be attending or planning to attend school at an accredited graduate institution in an appropriate Health Professions training program (as physician, dentist, optometrist, clinical psychologist, nurse, nurse anesthetist or other allied health profession). The best time to apply for a four-year scholarship is the fall before the year the applicant plans to attend professional school. Scholarships are offered for one, two, three, and four-year terms. While on scholarship, the awardee will spend 45 days on active duty in the Air Force, and once they graduate, in exchange for the scholarship, their commitment to the Air Force is to serve active duty (one year for each year of scholarship, with a minimum of three years). Some third- and fourth-year medical students have the opportunity to serve a clerkship at an Air Force medical center. Award: Up to 4 years of tuition (two years for PA master's degree), and additional school costs covered, as well as a monthly stipend.

• Financial Assistance Program (FAP)

The Air Force Financial Assistance Program for medical and dental residencies can help the awardee complete their residency. Upon completion of their residency, they will have a one-year obligation for each year of participation, plus one extra year. Awards: awardee will receive more than \$45,000 for every year they participate in the program and receive a stipend of over \$2,000 a month to cover living expenses.

## American Foreign Service Assoc National High School Essay Contest

#### 2021 Essay Contest Topic

What characteristics lead to a successful effort by diplomats and peacebuilders to mediate or prevent violent conflict? The United States Foreign Service—often referred to as America's first line of defense—works to prevent conflict from breaking out abroad and threats from coming to our shores. Peacebuilders work on the ground to create the conditions for peace and resolve conflicts where they are most needed. Successful essays will identify, in no more than 1,250 words, a situation where diplomats worked on a peacebuilding initiative with partners from the country/region in question, nongovernmental organizations, and other parts of the U.S. government, and then go on to analyze what characteristics and approaches made the enterprise a success.

**Length:** Your essay should be at least 1,000 words but should not exceed 1,250 words (word count does not apply to the list of sources). The word count must be included on the document you submit.

Content and Judging: Submissions will be judged on the quality of analysis, quality of research, and form, style and mechanics. Successful entries will answer all aspects of the prompt and demonstrate an understanding of the Foreign Service. The top five essays from each region will advance to the final round of judging that will determine the winner, runner-up, and honorable mentions. All decisions of the judges are final. All qualifying essays will be judged blind through several rounds of judging. All decisions of the judges are final.

Sources: Standards of content and style from current edition of the MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers will be expected for (1) documentation of sources in the text of your memo; (2) the format of the list of works cited; and (3) margins and indentation. A bibliography following the MLA Handbook must be included. Essays should use a variety of sources—academic journals, news magazines, newspapers, books, government documents, publications from research organizations. At least three of the cited materials should be primary sources (a document, speech, or other sort of evidence written, created or otherwise produced during the time under study). General encyclopedias, including Wikipedia, are not acceptable as sources. Essays citing general encyclopedias in notes or bibliography will be disqualified. Websites should not be the only source of information for your essay; when you do use online sources they must be properly cited.

#### Submission:

- Fill out the registration form. All fields on the online form are required, including uploading a Microsoft Word (.doc or .docx) file of your original work with a title, in English which should include a comprehensive list of sources consulted. Entries must be typed, double-spaced, in 12-point Times New Roman or an equivalent font with a one-inch margin on all sides of the page.
- Teacher or Sponsor: Student registration forms must have a teacher or sponsor name. That person may review the submitted essay and act as the key contact between participants and AFSA. It is to the student's advantage to have a coordinator review the essay to make sure it is complete, contains all the necessary forms, is free from typographical and grammatical errors, and addresses the topic.

- Do not place your last name or your school's name on any of the pages of the essay. Only the registration form should include this information.
- Faxed submissions will not be accepted.
- Your essay will be disqualified if it does not meet the requirements or is submitted after the submission date of 11:59 p.m. EDT on April 5, 2021.

Eligibility: Students whose parents are not in the Foreign Service are eligible to participate if they are in grades nine through twelve in any of the fifty states, the District of Columbia, the U.S. territories, or if they are U.S. citizens/lawful permanent residents attending high school overseas. Students may be attending a public, private, or parochial school. Entries from home-schooled students are also accepted. Previous first-place winners and immediate relatives of directors or staff of the AFSA, the U.S. Institute of Peace, Semester at Sea and National Student Leadership Conference are not eligible to participate. he <u>College Board Opportunity Scholarships</u> are now open for class of 2022 students. The program lays out six simple steps that all students can take to get to college.

For the class of 2022, the College Board Opportunity Scholarships program will help even more students plan for college, address affordability concerns, and connect them with other scholarship opportunities. Here are a few key changes to the program for the class of 2022:

- More than 7,000 students will earn a scholarship each year, nearly double the number of winners in previous years.
- All scholarship steps for the class of 2022 will be awarded for the same amount: \$500. The Complete Your Journey award will remain \$40,000.
- There's a new Explore Scholarships step to help students find scholarship opportunities that may be a good fit for them. And there's a simplified Practice for the SAT® step that will guide students to begin personalized SAT practice just for them.

At least half of all the scholarships—over \$2 million each year—are awarded to students whose families <u>earn less than \$60,000 per year</u>.
