Ron Brown Scholar Program

The Ron Brown Scholarship honors the legacy of Ronald H. Brown through a selective scholarship program that advances higher education for community-minded and intellectually gifted **African Americans**. Applicants should be talented and economically challenged **high school seniors** who demonstrate a keen interest in public service, community engagement, business entrepreneurship and global citizenship. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents, Black/African American, current high school seniors and demonstrate financial need. Two letters of recommendation and two essays are required. Current college students are not eligible to apply. The students designated as Ron Brown Scholars may use the need and merit-based scholarships to attend the four-year college or university of their choice in any specific field or career objective. Applications are screened between November and February and in March, finalists are invited to participate in a weekend selection process in Washington, D.C. at the expense of the Ron Brown Scholar Fund. Scholarship winners are selected based on their applications,

interviews, and participation in Selection Weekend activities. Awards: 45 - 50 four-year \$40,000 scholarships (\$10,000 each year).

Association Of Women In International Trade WIIT Scholarship Program

This merit-based scholarships are awarded twice per year to support and encourage **women studying all aspects of International Trade**, including trade policy and negotiations, global business and supply chains, economic development, women's economic empowerment, and more. Applicants must identify as female and be currently enrolled at an accredited U.S. university or college, either full-time or part-time. Applicants must be juniors or seniors in undergraduate or enrolled in graduate studies. **Essays** must be on a relevant international trade topic and can either be a bespoke essay submission or an appropriately

American Indian Services (AIS) Scholarship

American Indian Services Scholarship is available for Native Americans pursuing their **first undergraduate degree**, or a **professional/technical certificate**. This scholarship from Kia America, is available if you are majoring in any of the following disciplines: **Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, or Mathematics** (or extended fields), maintain a minimum **cumulative GPA of 2.25** and can demonstrate an unmet need. Applicants to this **essay contest** must be enrolled or will enroll in a university, college, junior college, or technical school (incoming first-year student accepted) and must be at least One-Quarter (1/4) enrolled member of a Federally Recognized Native American Tribe. Applicants must be an undergraduate student with no more than 150 semester credits or 210 quarter credits, first bachelor's degree only. Graduate studies are not eligible. Can be full-time or part-time status, excluding non-credit courses (minimum of 6 credits). Awards: Varies, ranging from \$500 to a maximum of \$2,000. If your term starts in December, January, February, or March you would apply for Award IV.

Upload a list of honors, clubs, social activities, employment, volunteer experiences, talents, and interests (resumes are accepted), a recent, high-resolution, color photograph to upload, copy of the official acceptance notice, transcripts and an essay (500-750 words), responding to the following topics: "1) Write a brief autobiography, which includes your characteristics and general outlook on life; 2) Select the most significant event in your life and discuss how it affected you; 3) Briefly discuss your professional goals and how you hope to achieve them; 4) Tell us why you would

Women's Independence Scholarship Program (WISP)

WISP is available nationally to women who have left an abusive domestic situation and who are pursuing an education designed to provide economic independence for themselves and their children. Applicant should be a **woman** who **survived intimate partner abuse** and has been separated from their abuser a minimum of one year, but not more than seven, U.S. citizen or permanent legal resident (eligible for FAFSA), who applied to or is officially accepted into an accredited course of study at a United States institution, demonstrates a critical need for financial assistance, exhibits a strong desire and the ability to complete a training and/or academic program and has a definite plan to use the desired training to upgrade skills for career advancement, to train for a new career field, or to enter or reenter the job market and has sought services from a non-profit, domestic violence agency for a minimum of 6 consecutive months (and this agency is willing act as sponsor by mentoring and providing support to the student throughout her educational experience). First-time applications are accepted twice a year: January 1–March 1 and September 1 – November 1. Renewal applications are accepted once a year: January 1–March 1. Next application cycle will begin September 1, 2022. Awards: range from \$500-\$2,000 per semester or quarter.

2023 Berkeley Prize

The Berkeley Undergraduate Prize for Design Excellence endowment was established to promote architecture as a social art through research, writing, and criticism. This is an **essay contest** in three stages. Each year, the Prize Committee selects a topic critical to the investigation of the social art of architecture and poses a question based on that topic. Students enrolled full-time in any accredited **undergraduate architecture program** or **diploma in architecture program** throughout the world are invited to submit a 500-word essay proposal in English responding to the question: "What are the major issues and the best design responses in your local community for the special needs of your senior citizens? Qualified students may also team up with undergraduates from architecture, landscape architecture, urban studies, arts and humanities, the social sciences, or engineering and submit proposals in teams of two. Applicants should also provide one photograph of their two best chosen projects. Awards: a total prize of 35,000 USD, minimum 8,500 USD first prize. The remaining purse is to be allocated among a minimum of the next three high scoring essays.

Regeneron Science Talent Search Scholarship

The Regeneron Science Talent Search (Regeneron STS) is the nation's oldest and most prestigious **science competition for high school seniors**, providing an important forum for original research that is recognized and reviewed by a national jury of professional scientists. Annually, over 1,800 high school seniors from around the country accept the challenge of conducting independent science, math or engineering research and completing an entry for the Regeneron Science Talent Search. Essay questions, test scores, recommendations and Scientific Research Report must be submitted. The competition recognizes 300 student scholars and their schools each year and invites 40 student finalists to Washington, D.C. to participate in final judging, display their work to the public, and meet with notable scientists and government leaders. Applicants must be students who are enrolled and attending their senior year of high school in the U.S. or territories or are a U.S. citizen studying abroad. Awards: 300 scholarships are available. The first-place prize is \$250,000 -the largest academic prize available to a high school student in the United States. The application period for 2022 is June 1 to November 9, 2022.

Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Student Competition

Scholarship is available to current **high school seniors** who are **citizens of the United States.** High school graduates are not eligible. Male and female students compete separately. Scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree, on a full-time basis in a U.S. college or university. Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need. National Semi-Finalists are required to submit updated application information, along with an essay and teacher's evaluation. Awards: 500 four-year scholarships, ranging from \$1,000 to \$12,500 per year. The top 20 finalists will be vying for two first-place awards of \$50,000, two second-place awards of \$40,000 and two third-place awards of \$30,000. The remaining 14 finalists will receive awards of \$20,000. The 480 runners-up will receive fifth-place scholarships of \$4,000. IISE Scholarships

IISE's scholarship and fellowship program is in place to recognize graduate and undergraduate industrial engineering students for academic excellence and campus leadership. Applicants must be active Institute members, be enrolled full time in graduate or undergraduate industrial engineering programs and have an overall GPA average of 3.4 and have a graduation date of May/June 2023 or later. The awards are valued up to \$4,000. Students may not apply directly for any scholarships except for the Vinod and Gail Sahney Scholarship. They must be nominated by IE department heads or faculty advisors and nominations must be submitted to the Institute headquarters by Nov. 15. The Vinod and Gail Sahney Scholarship deadline is Dec. 31. Among the scholarships are:

o A.O. Putnam Memorial Scholarship

Available to undergraduate students enrolled in any school in the United States and its territories, Canada, and Mexico in an engineering program accredited by an agency recognized by IISE. Award: one scholarship of \$1,000 was awarded for the academic year 2019-20.

o The Harold and Inge Marcus Scholarship

Available to undergraduate students enrolled in any school with an engineering program accredited by an agency recognized by IISE. The student should be pursuing a course of study in industrial engineering. Awards: Approximately 11 scholarships of \$1,000 each.

C.B. Gambrell Undergraduate Scholarship

Available to undergraduate industrial engineering students who are U.S. citizens who have graduated from a U.S. high school and who currently have a class standing above the first-year level in an ABET accredited IE program. Award: one scholarship of \$2,000.

Dwight D. Gardner Scholarship

Available to undergraduate students enrolled in any school in the United States and its territories, Canada, and Mexico, provided the school's industrial engineering program or equivalent is accredited by an agency or organization recognized by IISE. The student should be pursuing a course of study in industrial engineering. Awards: Six scholarships of \$3,500 and two of \$3,000.

If nominated for any of the above scholarships, students are eligible for other scholarships with an emphasis on student IISE involvement and leadership (as the Lisa Zaken Award for Excellence and the Presidents Scholarship) and are also eligible for the following scholarships, if meet the requirements:

UPS Scholarship for Female Students

Available to undergraduate students enrolled in any school in the United States and its territories, Canada, and Mexico, provided that the school's industrial engineering program or equivalent is accredited by an agency or organization recognized by IISE. The student should be pursuing a course of study in industrial engineering. Two scholarships of \$4,000 each were awarded for the academic year 2022-23.

UPS Scholarship for Minority Students

Available to undergraduate students enrolled in any school in the United States and its territories, Canada, and Mexico, provided that the school's industrial engineering program or equivalent is accredited by an agency or organization recognized by IISE. The student should be pursuing a course of study in industrial engineering. Two scholarships of \$4,000.

BigFuture will also award two \$40,000 scholarships every month between now and February 2023. By exploring scholarships, you will also automatically earn 1 entry for every \$40,000 drawing.

Strengthen Your College List

Students in the class of 2023 who **strengthen** (or update) their college list with at least three reach colleges, two match colleges, and one safety will earn entries in monthly drawings for \$500 and \$40,000 scholarships. Hope for Healing Scholarship

The "Hope for Healing" Scholarship is an effort to encourage more of America's best and brightest students to pursue a rewarding and impactful vocation in the field of addiction and mental health treatment. Awards applicable to academic focus in an *area of study related to mental and behavioral health, nursing, or addiction medicine*. Eligible students are: Undergraduate and graduate students currently enrolled in a degree program in mental/behavioral health, nursing, or addiction medicine; and Veterans, minorities, and people with disabilities currently enrolled in a graduate or undergraduate degree program in mental/behavioral, nursing, or addiction medicine. There is a 3.0 required GPA for those who are applying as first-year students or at higher levels. For graduating seniors in high school, the required GPA is 3.5. Awards: two awards of \$5,000 each annually. Scholarship is an annual offering that accepts applications on a rolling basis. FHE is accepting applications throughout the selection period in any given year. The next period of selection will end on February 11, 2022.

MDC Last Mile Completion Scholarship

Students who left MDC without completing their degrees due to *financial hardships* now can finish what they started by enrolling in the Last Mile Completion Scholarship Program. Applicants must be Florida residents, in good academic standing at MDC, within *13 credit hours of completing their first degree at MDC*, must have been enrolled in MDC within the past 8 years and stopped attending for at least the last major term (fall or spring). Students should have completed the 2022-22 Federal Financial Aid Application (FAFSA). Award: Scholarship pays for in-state tuition and fees of 13 credits or less. High-Cost Special Fees such as the Physician Assistant, Aviation or Culinary Arts programs are not covered.

Army ROTC Scholarships

Army ROTC has scholarships available for high school students, those already attending college and enlisted soldiers. For all scholarships, applicant should be a U.S. citizen, between the *ages of 17 and 26*, must have a high school *GPA of at least 2.5*, have a high school diploma or equivalent, score a minimum of 920 on the SAT (math/verbal) or 19 on the ACT, meet physical standards and agree to accept a commission and serve in the Army on Active Duty or in a Reserve Component (*Army Reserve or Army National Guard*). The applicant will first need to create a MY GOARMY account. Awards: Army ROTC scholarships are full-tuition scholarships and provide monthly living allowances for each school year depending on the year of study (1st year, \$300 per month, 2nd year, \$350 per month, 3rd year, \$450 per month, 4th year, \$500 per month), also providing the option for room and board in place of tuition (if applicant qualifies and additional allowances for books and fees.

High School Scholarship

Applicant for High School Scholarship must be committed to serve in the Army for eight years (serve full time in the Army for four years and four years with the Individual Ready Reserve (IRR)). Selected cadets may choose to serve part time in the Army Reserve or Army National Guard.

College Scholarships

College scholarships consist of two, three, and four-year full tuition scholarships based on the time remaining to complete the applicant's degree, the option for room and board in place of tuition, if the applicant should qualify and additional allowances for books and fees. Applicants for College scholarships must be committed to serve full time in the Army for four years. Selected cadets may choose to serve part-time in the Army Reserve or Army National Guard while pursuing a civilian career.

Enlisted Soldiers Scholarship

If already an enlisted soldier, Army ROTC can help them continue to grow and learn. The Army Green to Gold program provides options for soldiers interested in pursuing a baccalaureate or graduate degree and earning a commission as an Army Officer.

College Student Pre-Commissioning Initiative (Scholarship Program)

CSPI is a program designed for motivated individuals who demonstrate a high caliber of academic and leadership excellence and who desire to serve their country in the United States Coast Guard. Applicants must be between 19 and 27 years old. Students currently enrolled, accepted for enrollment or pending enrollment in a *full-time bachelor's degree program* at designated college or institution with the desire to complete college and receive a *guaranteed commission as an officer in the United States Coast Guard* can apply for CSPI. A student currently pursuing an AA/AS degree at a junior college or community college who plans to continue with their BS/BA degree may be eligible for CSPI if they are accepted for enrollment at a qualifying college. Applicants must be able to complete a bachelor's degree within 24 months. Awards: Varies.

Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP) and Financial Assistance Program (FAP)

Armed Forces Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP)

Each year the Air Force awards scholarships through the Armed Forces Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP). It pays for tuition, books, and most fees. The HPSP also gives students a monthly stipend for living expenses while they attend the school of their choice. Students should be U.S. citizens and be attending or planning to attend school at an accredited graduate institution in an appropriate *Health Professions training program (as physician, dentist, optometrist, clinical psychologist, nurse, nurse anesthetist or other allied health profession).* The best time to apply for a four-year scholarship is the fall before the year the applicant plans to attend professional school. Scholarships are offered for one, two, and four-year terms. While on scholarship, the awardee will spend 45 days on active duty in the Air Force, and once they graduate, in exchange for the scholarship, their commitment to the Air Force is to serve active duty (one year for each year of scholarship, with a minimum of three years). Some third- and fourth-year medical students can serve a clerkship at an Air Force medical center. Award: Up to 4 years of tuition (two years for PA master's degree), and additional school costs covered, as well as a monthly stipend.

Financial Assistance Program (FAP)

The Air Force Financial Assistance Program for medical and dental residencies can help the awardee complete their residency. Upon completion of their residency, they will have a one-year obligation for each year of participation, plus one extra year. Awards: awardee will receive more than \$45,000 for every year they participate in the program and receive a stipend of over \$2,000 a month to cover living expenses.

Florida Pathways to Success Scholarship

Families of Freedom Scholarship Fund

The terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001, left the nation and the world in shock. Along with Lumina Foundation, Scholarship America created the Families of Freedom Scholarship Fund to provide education assistance for post-secondary study to financially needy **dependents of those killed or permanently disabled because of the September 11, 2001, attacks.** Scholarships may be used to attend an accredited vocational-technical school, trade school, two-year college, four-year college, or university located in the United States. The spousal and domestic partner awards are based upon financial need. Students who show no financial need may receive a modest award for up to four years from one of various Families of Freedom sub funds. Scholarship America will administer the Families of Freedom Scholarship Fund to eligible families through the year 2030. Award: Varies. Application has several deadlines: Year Application: May — October; Fall Semester and Quarter Application: July — December; Spring Semester, Quarter & Winter Application: December — May; Summer Application: June — September.

Applicants from geographic areas within a Zonta district/region where no clubs are located will be eligible for the district/region and international awards. Awards: Zonta International offers up to 37 international awards of US\$5,000 each.

Walmart Live Better U program

Walmart's associate education benefit is designed to remove barriers to college enrollment and graduation. Walmart provides a tuition benefit available to part-time, full-time, and salaried employees who have been **employed by Walmart or Sam's Club** for at least 90 days. Live Better U offers 100% free **GED, trade school, and college degree programs** to Walmart employees. Employees would only have to pay \$1 a day to attend college. All these institutions provide degrees through online learning programs, enabling anyone in the country to attend. Check the website for programs and majors, as not all majors are eligible. Most of the degrees offered are business, technical, or trade oriented. Only associates without a prior bachelor's degree are eligible. Awards: Walmart pays for 100% of your tuition and fees. Associates can apply for each program online through the Guild website or LiveBetterU.com.

The Annie Henderson and Willie Johnson Scholarship Fund

Named after Dr. Maya Angelou's grandmother and uncle, the Annie Henderson and Willie Johnson Scholarship Fund is the flagship program of the Foundation. This annual scholarship awards two scholarships for two years to students at historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs). One award

is granted to a **general student** and the other scholarship is awarded to a **physically challenged/mobility-impaired or re-entry student.** The scholarship recipients must be progressing satisfactorily to qualify for the second year. Awards: two (2) two-year scholarships of \$3,000 each per scholarship year.

SAR - George S. and Stella M. Knight Essay Contest

The George S. and Stella M. Second Place: a \$2,500 and a recognition certificate. Third place: \$1,000 and a recognition certificate. The winning essay of the national contest will be submitted for publication in the SAR Magazine.

TEACH Grant

The U.S. Department of Education's Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education Grant (TEACH Grant) Program provides funds to students who are completing or who plan to complete coursework that is required to begin a *career in teaching*, and who, in exchange for receiving a TEACH Grant, agree to teach as highly qualified teachers for at least four academic years (within eight calendar years of completing the program of study for which they received the award) in public or private elementary or secondary schools that serves students from low income families. Applicants must have a cumulative *GPA of 3.25* and be enrolled in an eligible program. Students may receive one or more TEACH Grants to pay for their education Award: up to \$4,000 annually.
